

HACK IN SIX

READING HACK does #LoveToRead

Be part of something big. **BBC #LoveToRead** is a national campaign to get people reading and sharing the books they love. Get involved by doing and sharing this hack.

WHAT IS IT?

Recreate the plot of a book you love in six words, photos, emojis, drawings - or anything else you like!

HOW DO YOU DO IT?

Think about the big turning points of the story and how the main characters are feeling. Talk about the moments that made you laugh, cry, gasp and shout, then choose your six favourites to recreate any way you like.

WHAT DO YOU NEED?

Use a pen and paper, or get creative with something else. Instagram six photos, turn six pictures into a comic strip, Tweet your emojis or message another hacker and see if they can guess the book you're talking about.

WHO DOES IT?

You can do this hack on your own, or with a big group. If you're in a group you can talk about your favourite bits of the book together, or you might all choose different books and try to guess which ones the other hackers are talking about.
